RAP: Residential Assistance Program for Sober Living

The Residential Assistance Program (RAP) offers temporary financial aid to individuals in early recovery who need assistance covering the cost of sober living in MASH-certified sober houses. In partnership with the Bureau of Substance Addiction Services (BSAS), RAP funding helps eliminate financial barriers, ensuring access to safe and supportive housing during the critical transition from treatment to independent living.

Key Highlights of the RAP Sober Living Funding Program:

- **Who It’s For:** Individuals in early recovery with financial need.
 - **What It Covers:** Initial move-in costs and short-term rent assistance.
 - **Eligibility:** Must plan to reside in a MASH-certified sober house.
 - **How to Apply:** Apply directly with MASH [here](#).
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ATR: Access to Recovery Funding for Sober Living

The Access to Recovery (ATR) program provides financial assistance to individuals in early recovery who need help covering the cost of sober living in MASH-certified homes. Administered by BSAS, ATR funding supports individuals in their transition from treatment to stable housing, fostering long-term recovery and self-sufficiency.

Key Highlights of the ATR Sober House Resident Grant Program:

- **Who It's For:** Individuals in early recovery, having completed or currently engaged in treatment, and demonstrating financial need.
 - **What It Covers:** Partial or full sober house fees, short-term rental assistance, employment support, and recovery coaching.
 - **Eligibility:** Must be a Massachusetts resident, demonstrate financial hardship, and obtain a referral from a treatment provider or case manager.
 - **How to Apply:** Apply with a referral from an approved provider and complete an assessment to determine eligibility.
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Power Forward: Sober Living Financial Assistance in Massachusetts

Power Forward is a nonprofit organization that supports individuals in early recovery by offering financial assistance for sober living. The program ensures individuals have access to safe, supportive housing while they continue their recovery journey.

Key Highlights of the Power Forward Program:

- **Who It's For:** Individuals in early recovery needing financial support for sober living.
- **What It Covers:** Partial financial assistance for sober house fees and recovery-related expenses.
- **Eligibility:** Applicants must demonstrate financial need and a commitment to ongoing recovery.
- **How to Apply:** Submit applications directly through the Power Forward website [here](#).

Herren Project: Recovery Housing & Coaching Scholarships

The Herren Project offers Recovery Housing Scholarships to support individuals transitioning from addiction treatment to a sober living environment. The program provides financial assistance to ensure a structured, supportive setting as individuals continue their recovery journey.

Key Highlights of the Herren Project Program:

- **Who It's For:** Individuals who have completed treatment and are motivated to continue their recovery in a sober living environment.
- **What It Covers:** Financial assistance for rent at a vetted sober house for seven weeks.
- **Eligibility:** Applicants must be enrolled in treatment, referred by a case manager or counselor, and demonstrate commitment to recovery.
- **How to Apply:** Apply online through the Herren Project website [here](#).
- **Referral:** A referral from a case manager or counselor is required.
- **Personal Statement:** Both the applicant and case manager must submit statements explaining why the scholarship is needed.

Curran's Calling: Recovery Scholarships for Sober Living

Curran's Calling offers scholarships to assist individuals in early recovery by covering the cost of sober living, supporting their transition to independence. In addition to financial aid, the program offers life-skills mentoring and recovery coaching.

Key Highlights of the Curran's Calling Program:

- **Who It's For:** Individuals transitioning from inpatient treatment to sober living, aiming for long-term independence.
 - **What It Covers:** Up to \$750 for move-in costs or room and board, followed by an additional \$500 after 30 days. Those who complete the program may qualify for an Independent Living Scholarship of up to \$3,000 for first and last month's rent.
 - **Eligibility:** Applicants must seek sober housing in Massachusetts (with plans to expand to New Hampshire and Rhode Island) and demonstrate financial need and program engagement.
 - **How to Apply:** Complete the application through Curran's Calling and submit documentation of recovery and financial need.
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The Rule 62 Foundation: Sobriety Scholarships

The Rule 62 Foundation offers financial assistance for individuals unable to afford sober housing or treatment. Applications are reviewed promptly, and while approval is not guaranteed, the team aims to provide as much support as possible.

Resources for Recovery: Sober Living Scholarships

To receive a scholarship from Resources for Recovery, applicants must undergo detox (if medically necessary) and spend 2-4 weeks in a holding program. Those applying from detox or holding must provide a contact name, phone number, and sign a release for DMMF

committee members. An essay explaining the applicant's story and why they are a good candidate is also required.
